

Janssen Way Lesson Plan

Universal Expectations: Demonstrate appropriate behavior and use of materials in the computer lab.

Skill/Setting: Computer Lab

Grade level 4K-4

PURPOSE OF LESSON: (Define) (Why is this important?)

Students will understand how to take care of computer materials and equipment.

TEACHING AND EXAMPLES (Model):

The students will sit on the floor in front of the closet doors where they will be able to see the first computer on the left side of the back row. The teacher will ask the students to brainstorm respectful computer class behaviors that they remember from last year. Ideas that the children should include are; how to sit tall in the middle of the chair, feet on/toward the floor, hands off the “skins”, no touching the computer screen, voices off when the teacher is talking, raise hand if you need help, face the front, no chewing on headphone cords, don't touch cords on the back of the computer, push in chair when you leave, when putting head phones away ; grab the headphone by the ears, put it in the bag, follow the cord in like a snake, and fold the bag over, keep hands off the keyboard when the teacher is talking.

STUDENT ACTIVITIES (Practice): (student modeling and role play/multi-modal activities, etc)

Each child will go to a computer and practice sitting properly, practice using the headphones, and then put the headphones away. Each teacher can tell what his or her specific routine is for putting away the headphones.

FOLLOW UP/REINFORCEMENT ACTIVITIES: (Re-teach, Model, Practice, Acknowledge)

Students will also have continual practice during computer classes with the classroom teacher.

Materials

1 headphone per computer.
