## Janssen Way Lesson Plan

#### **Universal Expectations:**

Skill/Setting: The Hallway Grade level 4K-4

**Station Place: Library Pit** 

PURPOSE OF LESSON (Define): (Why is this important?)

To demonstrate how to move safely and respectfully in the hallway.

### **TEACHING AND EXAMPLES (Model):**

- 1. Using the Hallway Matrix go through expectations and why they are important
- 2. Using Line Basic Poster discuss the 5 expectations for line basics and what that looks like
- 3. Practice the chant of the poster
  - Teacher states: "Facing" children states: "Front"
  - Teacher states: "Hands by your" children states: "side"
  - Teacher states: "Quiet walking" children states: "feet"
  - Teacher states: "Stay in your" children states: "line"
  - Teacher states: "Voices" children states: "off"
- 4. Talk about the flow of traffic that you always stay to the right when you are walking in the hallway

### STUDENT ACTIVITIES (Practice): (student modeling and role play/multi-modal activities, etc)

- 1. Teacher tells the students to walk to the library doors that are towards the front of building
- 2. The teacher states: "Give Me 5-Line Basics"
- 3. The teacher will start the chant and the students will finish the last word like they heard above
- 4. The teacher will lead the students to the right towards the 4K/5K rooms following line basics and hallway expectations and staying to the right of the hallway
- 5. The teacher will do a U-turn once they get through the 4K/5K entrance and go back to the library by staying to the right in the hallway.

#### **FOLLOW UP/REINFORCEMENT ACTIVITIES:** (Re-teach, Model, Practice, Acknowledge)

1. If time permits discuss why it is important to be in a line and follow the flow of traffic in the hallways.
